





Usual journey to school (pupils/parents)

Concerns/problems of both residents and parents

- Cars reversing in/out driveways
- Cars parked over residents' driveways
- Parking charges and time allotted for dropping off/picking up
- Narrow section of Portland Road nearby school and when cars pulling out in this specific area, very precarious
- Narrow pavements
